

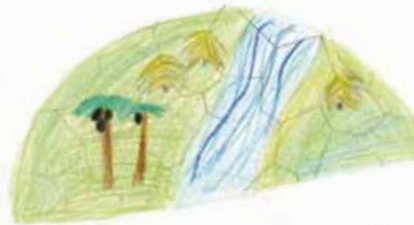
# My favourite geography lesson...

Pupils from Wyche Primary School in Malvern were asked to describe their favourite geography lesson. Hopefully there are some ideas here that you might like to try.



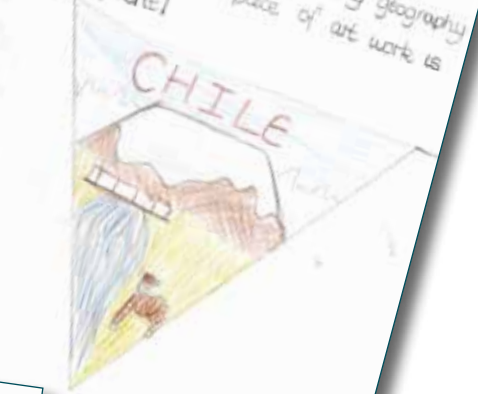
